"Legal Research and Writing: From Law School to Law Firm - How Librarians Help"

Guest Speaker George Tsiakos will be discussing the UBC Law Library's role in teaching legal research and writing skills to law students. George will explain how the law library initially got involved in the program and its current responsibilities and role. He will highlight what is taught in the upper year advanced legal research courses as well as the new first year legal research and writing course. George will also provide some advice on how law firm librarians can assist law students in further developing their legal research skills.

George Tsiakos is currently the Instruction Librarian at the UBC Law Library. Over the past five years, he has taught legal research and writing courses as an adjunct professor at the UBC Faculty of Law. In his current role as Instruction Librarian, George coordinates and teaches in the UBC Law Faculty's Legal Research and Writing program, including the new first-year Legal Research and Writing course. Previously, George was employed at Bull, Housser & Tupper LLP as a Research Librarian from 2008 - 2010 and as the Manager of Library Services from 2010 - 2012.
